## MEMORANDUM BY THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE AND PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS

## Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Cap. 136)

The attached Declaration by His Excellency the Governor-General refers to the acquisition of three premises at Mosta.

As these premises are permanently required by the Fovernment, it is proposed that they be acquired by absolute purchase.

These three premises are required by Government for the purpose of road widening; they are therefore required for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136).

From the report submitted by the Land Engineer it transpires that the total freehold value of the above three premises amounts to £1911. 13s. 4d.

Honourable Ministers are invited to recommend.

## DECLARATION BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL

I hereby declare that the undermentioned land is required by the competent authority for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136) and that the acquisition thereof is to be by absolute purchase.

## Description of the land.

The following land at Mosta:-

- 1. Premises No. 43 Parish Street, comprising two rooms and part of the garden of the area of 91 square canes, bounded on the North-West and on the North-East by Parish Street, and on the South and on the South-East by the remaining portion of the land of which it forms part; it is the property of Mrs. Rosalia Mifsud and others.
- 2. Premises No. 44 Parish Street, property of Mrs. Rocalia Mifsud and others.
- 3. Premises No. 45 Parish Street, property of Mrs. Helen Gulia and others.

The above mentioned land is shown on a plan marked L.D. 227/66 which may be seen on demand at the Land Office, 29 South Street, Valletta.
