PASSPORT REGULATIONS.

13118

1. Any person applying for a British passport is required to complete a declaration on a form, copies of which can be obtained on application at the Passport Office, The Palace, Valletta.

The said form shall be completed so as to furnish information on each and every one of the particulars as to which space is left for the giving of information required.

2. The declaration, including the personal description or descriptions shall be completed by the applicant in his or her own handwriting unless the applicant is unable to write, in which case it may be completed by the person who signs the subsidiary declaration and verified and countersigned by the Passport Officer.

3. The applicant shall give all information which is directly or indirectly asked for by any note, mark or direction in any part of the said form or in any marginal note whatever appearing thereon.

4. In case any child under the age of 18 years require a passport, an application therefor shall be made by the parent or guardian of such child and the provisions of Articles 1-3 (inclusive) of these Regulations shall be observed with regard to such application. The application shall be completed on a special form, copies of which can be obtained at the Passport Office, The Palace, Valletta.

5. The subsidiary declaration or recommendation to be made on behalf of the applicant set out below the declaration to be made by the latter on the forms prescribed in Articles 1 and 4 of these Regulations, shall be completed and signed by a responsible British subject possessing one of the following qualifications, that is to say, Naval, Military or Air Force Officer commanding a ship, unit or establishment, Cashier of His Majesty's Dockyard, Banker, Minister of Religion, Advocate, Physician, Surgeon, Notary Public, Land Surveyor or Legal Procurator. Such recommendation shall be made only upon personal knowledge of the applicant by the person recommending.

6. Together with the completed form of application, there shall be produced duplicate unmounted photographs of a size of approximately 2 3/4 by 2 inches of the applicant, and, if she is included in the application, of his wife. One copy of each photograph shall be certified on the back thereof by the person who recommends the application in the following terms:—

"I certify this to be a photograph of.....",

7. Any applicant for a passport may be required to have his form of application countersigned by the Police Inspector of the district in which such applicant resides.

8. Passports are granted:—
(1) to natural born British subjects,
(2) to the wives and widows of such persons,

and
(3) to persons naturalised in the United Kingdom, in the British Dominions or Colonies, or in India.

The wife of an alien shall be deemed to be an alien.

9. If the applicant for a passport be a British subject by naturalisation, the certificate of naturalisation must be produced at the Passport Office. British subjects by naturalisation will be described as such in the passports which will be issued subject to the necessary qualifications.

10. British passports are available only for travel to the countries named thereon, but may be endorsed for additional countries. The possession of a passport so endorsed does not, however, exempt the holder from compliance with any Immigration regulations in force in British or foreign countries or from the necessity of obtaining a visa where required.

11. Passports endorsed as valid for the British Empire are also available for travelling to territory under British protection or mandate, not, however, including Palestine or Irak for which countries the passport must be specially endorsed.

12. Passports are available for five years from the date of issue, unless otherwise stated. On the expiration of their period of validity, they may be renewed for further consecutive periods of one to five years. In no circumstances are they available beyond ten years from the date of issue. Thereafter, or if at any time the passport contains no further space for visas, application must be made for the issue of a new passport.

13. A passport cannot be issued by the Passport Office, Malta, on behalf of a person already abroad; such person should apply for one to the nearest British Mission or Consulate. Passports must not be sent out of Malta by post.

14. A person arriving from or intending to proceed to any place out of these Islands as a passenger shall not, without the special permission of the Governor, land or embark at any port in these Islands unless he has in his possession, a valid passport or some other document establishing his nationality and identity. To every such passport or document must be affixed a photograph of the person to whom it relates.

15. On every passport or document of identity of a non-British subject, intending to establish his residence in these Islands, or to exercise therein a profession, a trade or an industry of any sort, there must be a valid visa of a British Consular or Passport Authority.

16. British subjects who are in possession of a passport and are desirous of leaving these Islands for any destination, except for a direct journey by sea to the United Kingdom, shall present their passport at the Passport Office, The Palace, Valletta, for registration.

17. Non-British subjects in possession of a valid passport shall have their passports endorsed at the Police Office at the Custom House, Valletta, before leaving these Islands for any destination.

THIS FORM MUST BE RETURNED TO THE PASSPORT OFFICE AT LEAST THREE CLEAR DAYS BEFORE THE PASSPORT IS REQUIRED.
