PWD (Lands) 1187/60 Release of three plots of lands in the limits of St. John's and Birkirkara (Memo. No. 73).

It was explained that in December, 1960 the Council of Government had advised that twenty plots of land within the limits of St. John's and Birkirkara be acquired for the purpose of widening St. Andrew's Road.

The pertinent declaration by the Governor in terms of section 8(1) of the Land Requisition (Public Purpose) Ordinance (Chapter 136) was duly published.

When the execution of the project was taken in hand it had emerged that out of the original twenty plates involved, plates 1, 2 and 5 were no longer required.

Mr. Minister agreed that H.C. be advised to issue a Declaration for the release of the three plates in view of the fact that they were no longer required for a public purpose.
