

MEMORANDUM BY THE HON. MINISTER OF JUSTICE

LAND ACQUISITION (PUBLIC PURPOSES) ORDINANCE  
(Cap.136)

The attached Declaration by His Excellency the Governor-General covers two plots of land in the limits of Hamrun. It is proposed to acquire by title of absolute purchase.

The land in question is required by Government in connection with the extension of the Milk Marketing Undertaking Depot. It is therefore required for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136). No immovable structures are involved in the proposed acquisition.

It emerges from the report by the Land Engineer that an inspection in situ and after taking into consideration the locality as well as other factors which could have a bearing on the value of the property in question that its freehold value amounts to £164.

Honourable Ministers are invited to recommend.

DECLARATION BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL

I hereby declare that the undermentioned land is required by the competent authority for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136) and that the acquisition thereof is to be by absolute purchase.

Description of the land

The following land at Hamrun.

1. A plot of land of the area of 4 sieghan and 4.4 kejllet, bounded on the East partly by property of St George's Parish Church of Qormi and partly by Government property, on the South by Government property and on the West by the remaining portion of the land of which this plot forms part; it is the property of Mr Albert Said.

2. A plot of land of the area of 2 sieghan and 1.0 kejllet, bounded on the East and on the South by Government property, on the West by property of Mr Albert Said and on the North by the remaining portion of the land of which this plot forms part; it is the property of St George's Parish Church, Qormi administered by the Reverend Archpriest Gerald Frendo.

The above plots of land are shown on a plan marked L.D. 96/65 which may be seen on demand at the Land Office, 29, South Street, Valletta.
