

MEMORANDUM BY THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE
AND PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS

Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Cap. 136)

The attached Declaration by His Excellency the Governor-General refers to the compulsory acquisition of four plots of land at Saint Julians.

Since this land is permanently required by the Government, it is proposed to acquire it by absolute purchase.

The above plots of land are required by the Government for the purpose of road widening; they are therefore required for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136).

From the report by the Land Engineer it transpires that the total freehold value of the above plots of land amounts to £921. 0. 0.

Honourable Ministers are invited to recommend.

DECLARATION BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL

I hereby declare that the undermentioned land is required by the competent authority for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136) and that the acquisition thereof is to be by absolute purchase.

Description of the Land

The following land at Saint Julians:

1. A plot of land of the area of 1.17 square canes, bounded on the West by Saint Julians Hill, on the South by Old College Street and on the East by property of Mr. Anthony Baldacchino.
2. A plot of land of the area of 2.25 square canes, bounded on the West, South and North by Saint Julians Hill, and on the East by property of Professor Joseph M. Ganado LL.D.
3. A plot of land of the area of 9.5 square canes, bounded on the West and South-West by Saint Julians Hill, and on the East by property of Professor Joseph M. Ganado LL.D.
4. A plot of land of the area of 3.57 square canes, bounded on the North and West by property of the Sisters of Charity and on the East by Saint Julians Hill.

The abovementioned land is shown on plan marked L.D. 287/70, which may be seen on demand at the Land Office, 29, South Street, Valletta.
