

MEMORANDUMProtocol of Amendment to Article 50 (a)
of the Convention on International Civil Aviation

On the 12th March, 1971, the Assembly of the International Civil Aviation Organization held an Extraordinary Session at New York to consider the general desire of Contracting States to enlarge the membership of the Council. This entailed the amendment of Article 50 (a) of the Convention on International Civil Aviation.

The aforesaid amendment was unanimously approved by the Assembly thus providing for three additional seats in the Council and accordingly increasing its membership from twenty-seven to thirty. A Protocol embodying the amendment was subsequently drawn up by the Secretary-General of the Organization.

Malta, as a signatory of the Convention, is now being invited together with the other Contracting States, to urgently ratify the amendment in order that the Assembly may elect the Council on the basis of the Convention as amended, at its next meeting in mid-June, 1971. It is to be noted that the amendment of the Convention increasing the membership of the Council will in no way affect the assessments of States when it comes into force.

The Director of Civil Aviation agrees that the aforesaid amendment should be ratified.

The Crown Advocate-General concurs with the foregoing.

It is to be noted that the amendment of the Convention increasing the membership of the Council will in no way affect the assessments of States when it comes into force.

The Director of Civil Aviation agrees that the aforesaid amendment should be ratified.

The Crown Advocate-General concurs with the foregoing.
