(Mr. A. Solomon, Financial Secretary, was
in attendance).

The Cabinet considered
the reports of the Committee appointed
to examine the possibility of the
construction of a new Valletta Market

on the old site by a Corporation and to suggest ways and means to safeguard the interests of present stall holders. It was decided that pending a detailed study of the report, the Public Works Department should take in hand immediately all work necessary to remove the existing danger in the roof structure of the Vallette Market. The Hon. Prime Minister spoke to the Director of Public Works on the phone and informed him accordingly. The Financial Secretary was asked to provide in the current year's Estimates a sum of up to £26,000 for this purpose.

Developments of Manoel Island (Memo. No. 280)
(Maj. F. Amato Janzi, Under Secretary for External Affairs, was in attendance)

The question of the development of Manoel Island was considered. The Hon. Minister of Industrial Development & Tourism ~~was~~ ~~not~~ ~~contingent~~ agreed that the development of the Island for tourism was not contingent on the whole of the Island being made available for the purpose and it was considered that the continued presence of the naval centres would not hamper in any way the plans for Manoel Island. It was therefore agreed that the Naval Authorities

ii) we agreed to return their present Joint Tactical School, the Signal Training Centre and the Fleet Clearance Diving Centre, which were sited in two shore establishments on Manoel Island and which they proposed to join by an enclosing fence for security and demarcation purposes; and

ii) be allowed the temporary use of Manoel Island Services Club for a period of three years after which the Club, if required by the Government, would be incorporated in any plans for the development of Manoel Island.
