Amendment to Section 31 of the Import Duties
 Act, 1964. (Memo. No. 331)

The Cabinet agreed
 that a Bill entitled An Act to amend
 the Import Duties Act, 1964, be submitted
 to the House of Representatives for approval.
 The object of the Act was to empower the

Governor-General to make in relation to the Import Duties Act, 1964, any regulations which may become necessary for the operation of certain provisions of the Act.

The Vernon Club, the Red Shield Club (Salvation Army) and the Cunnought Home (Methodist Foundation) (Memo. No. 325).

The Services in Malta had submitted that they wished the Vernon Club, the Red Shield Club and the Cunnought Home to be recognized as Authorized Service Organizations with limited privileges in accordance with the provisions of section 1(g) of Part 1 of the Annex to the Agreement on Mutual Defence and Assistance.

The Cabinet agreed that

(i) the Red Shield Club and the Cunnought Home should not be classified as Authorized Service Organizations, but that special arrangements, as described in para. 6 of Memorandum No. 325 at Red 11 in file, be applied to individual cases of United Kingdom-based personnel forming part of these two organizations;

(ii) the Vernon Club be recognized as an Authorized Service Organization for the purpose of section 8(1) of Part 5 of the Agreement on Mutual Defence and Assistance, provided the Services agreed that the Club would be recognized as an

Authorized Service Organization also for the purposes of Part 4 of the Agreement relating to land.

Confirmation of written opinion

The files mentioned below were circulated to Ministers whose written decision was as follows:-

Lands 1540/61. H.E. The Governor was advised to sign Declaration for the acquisition of land at "Sal Amis", limits of Suda required for road widening.

Land 246/64. H.E. The Governor was advised to sign Declaration for the release of a plot of land at Naassa which is no longer required for a public purpose.

Land 1252/63. H.E. The Governor was advised to sign Declaration for the acquisition of land at Diggendi required for widening Providence Street.
