Amendments to the Gros local Government
Ordinance 1961 (Ordinance XI of 1961) - Memo No 334.

Amendment to the Employment Service Act 1955 (Act No XIV of 1955)

(Mr Thomas Sammut, Higher Executive Officer was in attendance)

The Hon Minister of Labour and Social Welfare explained that in terms of Section 13, sub-paragraph (2) (a) of the Employment Service Act 1955, before it was repealed in 1959, employers who had 50 or more employees in their employment had to take on additional personnel through the labour office. This provision was repealed by Emergency Ordinance No VI of 1959 which became effective on the 8th February 1959.

It was agreed that Section 13 be re-introduced in full and that sub-paragraph (2) (a) which reads "50 employees employing in the aggregate less than 50 employees" be amended to read "50 employers employing in the aggregate less than 30 employees."
