Re-employment with the Government of persons
discharged in 1955 (Memo. No. 263)

The Cabinet considered
again this matter and further decided that
(i) section 13 of the Employment Service
Act 1955 be re-introduced in full and
that sub-paragraph (2)(a) which reads 'So

employers employing in the aggregate less than 50 employees" should be amended to read "To employers employing in the aggregate less than 30 employees";

(ii) the provisions of section 9 of the Employment Service Act 1955 should not apply if the person seeking employment with the Government had been discharged from Government service in terms of Circular OPM. 28/55 and the same person had been registering for employment for a continuous period of thirteen weeks;

(iii) both amendments as in (i) and (ii) above should be passed through Parliament with urgency.

Succession of Malta to International Treaties
(Memo. No. 328)

The Cabinet considered the question of Malta's succession to international agreements concluded on her behalf by the United Kingdom Government before independence.

It was agreed that

(a) course (iii) in para 4 of Memorandum be followed and the British Government be informed accordingly, and

(b) to complete a study of all treaties by the end of June, 1966.

Organization (Memo. No. 327).

It was decided that Malta should seek membership of the International Civil Aviation Organization by executing a document addressed to the Government of the United States notifying its adherence to the Chicago Convention, as explained in para. 3 of the Memorandum.

Disposal of new Government Dwellings
(Memo. No. 335)

It was agreed that new Government dwellings becoming available during the Second Five-Year Plan should not be leased by tender, and that pending further consideration of the matter such units should be disposed of by direct allocation and by points in the proportion which the Minister responsible for Housing thinks appropriate at the time.
