Site for Ministry of Works Building (Pavilion No 2)  
 (Mr S. Mungin was in attendance)

Hon Ministers after having perused

Memorandum No 366 agreed as follows:-

(a) the site in Bakery Street corner with Archbishop Street, Valletta, which is Government property, to be offered by tender for the purposes of having a block of flats erected for dwelling purposes, only the ground floor for shops or offices. The conditions for the grant of the site were to be prepared jointly by the Hon Minister of Justice and the Hon Minister of Works and Housing and the plans to be approved by the Director of Public Works;

(b) the Hon Minister of Works and Housing was authorized to seek advice from the Antiquities Committee as regards the complete demolition of the Garage Burns now used as an office by the Director of Immigration Labour and Social Welfare, and as a woodwork factory by Messrs Selia;

(c) the site in South Street corner with Old Mint Street, Valletta, which is Government property, to be offered by tender for purposes of having a block of flats erected for dwelling purposes, only the ground floor for shops or offices. The conditions for the grant of the site were to be prepared jointly by the Hon Minister of Justice and the Hon Minister of Works and Housing and the plans to be approved by the Director of Public Works;

(d) the site near Linton Barracks (Cable yard) was considered the most suitable for the Ministry of Works Building. The project merited further study in the

meantime the Administrative Secretary was authorized to ask the War Department whether that site, which is now owned in feehold, could be released to Government.

(e) & (f) the site between Montgomery House and the Catholic Institute and the occupation of Kington Barracks, if made available to Government, to be considered further at another meeting of the Cabinet.
