Deutsche Welle

The Deputy Crown Advocate General brought to the notice of Ministers a request by Deutsche Welle to start test broadcasts on frequency No. 1570 in order that the frequency can be registered at Geneva.

According to Deutsche Welle's information, Cyprus will shortly

be starting broadcasting on that frequency and it is therefore urgent for them to have that frequency registered in the name of Malta.

Ministers showed disappointment at the way Deutsche Welle were conducting the study regarding the frequency for Radio Malta and felt that steps to have the 2 frequencies registered should be more or less concurrent.
