

MEMORANDUM FOR THE CABINET BY THE
HON. PRIME MINISTER

Exemption from licence fees in respect of a car
owned by St. Joseph's Institute, Ghajnsielem, Gozo

In terms of regulation 5 of the Police Licences Regulations 1949 the Governor may remit or reduce any fee specified in the schedule to those regulations. St. Joseph's Institute, Malta, is one of those institutes which, in view of the philanthropic nature of its work, already enjoys exemption from the payment of licence fees in respect of certain vehicles.

2. The Commissioner of Police has lately received an application from St. Joseph's Institute, Ghajnsielem, Gozo, for exemption from licence fees in respect of a car owned by that Institute.

3. The Hon. Minister of Labour and Social Welfare strongly recommends this application adding that both the Malta and Gozo Institutions are being subsidized by Government and both are doing sterling work in the social field.

4. The Ministry of Economic Planning and Finance have no objection either to a free licence being issued in respect of this car and the fee will be charged, as in other cases, to the block provision under the Miscellaneous Services Vote covering exemption from customs and other duties for religious and philanthropic associations.

5. Hon. Ministers are asked whether they agree that H.E. the Governor be advised to approve the application by St. Joseph's Institute, Ghajnsielem, Gozo.
