The acquisition in terms of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance Chapter 136 is for a Public Purpose.

## DECLARATION BY THE GOVERNOR

I hereby declare that the undermentioned land is required by the competent authority for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136) and that the acquisition thereof is to be by absolute purchase.

- 3. Premises No. 26, St. Helen Square, property of the Birkirkara Parish Church.
- 4. Premises No. 27, St. Helen Square, property of Mrs. Elena Calleja.
- 5. Premises Nos. 28/29, ot. Helen Square, property of Mrs. Theresa Borg.
- 6. House and adjoining garden with entrance doors at No. 7, Buzaqq Lane and No. 2, Herba Alley No. 1, property of Mr. Carmel Cassar.
- 7. Garden with entrance from No. 8 Buzaqq Lane, property of Mr. Joseph Mallia.
- 8. Part of garden of the area of 66.5 square canes with entrance from the demolished house Nos. 30/31, St. Helen Square, bounded on the North by properties of Mr. Joseph Mallia and of Mr. Carmel Cassar, on the South-East and on the South by Government property and on the West by the remaining portion of the land of which it forms part; it is the property of Mrs. Emma Farrugia.
- 9. Premises No. 57, St. Helen Street, property of Miss Carmela Delicata.
