

MEMORANDUM FOR THE CABINET
BY THE HON. MINISTER OF JUSTICE

Section 38 of the Immigration
(British Subjects) Ordinance, 1948

It is provided by section 38 of the Immigration (British Subjects) Ordinance, 1948, that, subject to certain restrictions therein contained, the Governor may, in his absolute discretion, prohibit the entry into Malta and its Dependencies of any person who, in the opinion of the Governor, is not provided with suitable accommodation. This power of prohibition is, under the same section, renewable from year to year by Proclamation.

2. As it is expedient to continue section 38 in force for a further period of one year until the 15th day of March, 1966, Hon. Ministers are asked to agree that His Excellency the Governor-General be advised to issue a further Proclamation.
