

MEMORANDUM BY THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE
AND PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS.

Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136)

The attached Declaration by His Excellency the Governor-General refers to three plots of land at Zebbug.

Since this land is permanently required by the Government, it is proposed to acquire it by absolute purchase.

These three plots of land are required by the Government for the purpose of constructing a Civic Centre at Zebbug; they are therefore required for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136).

From the report submitted by the Land Engineer it transpires that the total freehold value of these three plots of land amounts to £2,772. 16. 3.

Honourable Ministers are invited to recommend.

DECLARATION BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL

I hereby declare that the undermentioned land is required by the competent authority for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136) and that the acquisition thereof is to be by absolute purchase.

Description of the Land.

The following land at Zebbug, Malta:-

1. A plot of land of the area of 74.75 square canes bounded on the North by property of the Parish Church of Zebbug, on the East by De Rohan Street and on the West by Sciortino Street; it is the property of Mr. Carmel Bugeja.
2. A plot of land of the area of 146 square canes including a farmhouse, bounded on the North by Paris Street, on the South by property of Mr. Carmel Bugeja and on the East by De Rohan Street, it is the property of the Parish Church of Zebbug.
3. A plot of land of the area of 4 square canes, bounded on the North by Paris Street, on the East by property of the Parish Church of Zebbug and on the West by Sciortino Street; it is the property of Mr. Carmel Bugeja.

The above mentioned land is shown on a plan marked L.D. 227/65 which may be seen on request at the Land Office, 29, South Street, Valletta.
