

MEMORANDUM FOR CABINET BY THE HON MINISTER OF
TRADE, INDUSTRY AND AGRICULTURE

Duty on tobacco imported in cut and blended form
T.N. - 24.02 (C)

In December, 1965 the Import Duties Act, 1964 was amended in order to postpone the levying of a higher rate of duty on tobacco cut or cut and blended but not further manufactured for another year up to 31st December 1966.

2. In enacting this amendment it was kept in mind that the higher rate which was originally intended to protect local industry, had in point of fact turned out to be against the interest of the particular industry involved. The enforcement of the higher rate would also have had the effect of losing a substantial foreign market, closing down small manufacturers with consequent discharge of employees, and increasing the prices of Cigarettes and of tobacco for 'roll-your own' trade which is consumed by the lower income group. The position was to be reviewed at the end of the period of postponement.

3. The reasons brought forward last year for the postponement of the higher rate of duty of 110 shillings are as forcèful today as they were a year ago. My Ministry has gone into the whole matter again and is satisfied that, once there are no logical reasons either from a revenue point of view or from an industrial development standpoint, early steps should be taken to reinstate the situation existing before the new rate of 110 shillings per kg. provided for under the Import Duties Act, 1964. **This recommendation has the support of the Ministry of Finance, Customs and Port.**

4. Ministers are requested to agree that the status quo ante be restored. The matter is being submitted as one of urgency because manufacturers have to confirm export deliveries some months in advance and they would not be able to establish export prices and to place orders for either leaf or cut tobacco unless they know that the law is to be amended. It is finally stressed that the above measure would be a great encouragement to the Tobacco industry to expand its export activities.
