

MEMORANDUM BY THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE
AND PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS

Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Cap. 136)

The attached Declaration by His Excellency the Governor-General refers to the compulsory acquisition of two plots of land at Wardija, limits of St. Paul's Bay.

Since these plots are permanently required by the Government, it is proposed to acquire them by absolute purchase.

The above land is required by the Government for the construction of a school for mentally retarded; it is therefore required for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136).

From the report by the Land Engineer it transpires that the total freehold value of the above two plots of land amounts of £539. 0. 0d.

Honourable Ministers are invited to recommend.

DECLARATION BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL

I hereby declare that the undermentioned land is required by the competent authority for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136) and that the acquisition thereof is to be by absolute purchase.

Description of the land

The following land at Wardija limits of St. Paul's Bay:-

1. A plot of land of the area of 3 Tmien, 1 Siegh, and 3.6 Kejllet, bounded on the East by property of the Dominican Priory of Rabat, Malta, on the South by Government property and on the North-West by the remaining portion of the land of which such plot forms part; it is the property of Miss Maria Meillaq and others.
2. A plot of land of the area of 2 Tmien and 7 Kejllet, bounded on the West and North by property of Miss Maria Meillaq and others, on the South-West by Government property, and on the East by the remaining portion of the land of which such plot forms part; it is the property of the Dominican Priory of Rabat, Malta.

The above mentioned land is shown on a plan marked L.D. 263/68, which may be seen on demand at the Land Office, 29 South Street, Valletta.
