

MEMORANDUM BY THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE AND
PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS

Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Cap.136)

The attached Declaration by His Excellency the Governor-General refers to the compulsory acquisition of five plots of land at Marsa.

Since this land is permanently required by the Government, it is proposed to acquire it by absolute purchase.

The above plots of land are required by the Government for the erection of the Electricity Power Station; they are therefore required for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136).

From the report by the Land Engineer it transpires that the total freehold value of the above plots of land amounts to £1,282. 0s. 0d.

Honourable Ministers are invited to recommend.

DECLARATION BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL

I hereby declare that the undermentioned land is required by the competent authority for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136) and that the acquisition thereof is to be by absolute purchase.

Description of the land

The following land at Marsaxlokk:

1. A plot of land of the area of 15.8 square canes, bounded on the East by Fra Diegu Street, and on the North and West by the remaining portion of the land of which such plot forms part; it is the property of Mr Salvatore Fava and others.
2. A plot of land of the area of 213 square canes, bounded on the North partly by property of Mr Salvatore Fava and others and partly by Fra Diegu Street, and on the North-East and South-West by property of the heirs of the late L.M. Farrugia; it forms part of the estate of the late Dr Pasquale De Lorenzo.
3. A plot of land of the area of 12.8 square canes, bounded on the North by property of the estate of the late Dr Pasquale De Lorenzo, on the East by property of Mr Louis Bertoli and others, and on the West by the remaining portion of the land of which such plot forms part; it is the property of the heirs of the late Anthony Cutajar.
4. A plot of land of the area of 433 square canes, bounded on the North by property of the heirs of the late L.M. Farrugia, on the West by property of the heirs of the late Anthony Cutajar, and on the South-East by Government property; it is the property of Mr Louis Bartolo and others.
5. A plot of land of the area of 94 square canes, bounded on the South-West by Government property, on the South-East by an alley, and on the North by the remaining portion of the land of which such plot forms part; it is the property of the heirs of the late Canon Lorenzo Micallef.

The abovementioned land is shown on a plan marked L.D. 350/68, which may be seen on demand at the Land Office, 29, South Street, Valletta.
