

MEMORANDUM BY THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE  
AND PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS

Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Cap.136)

The attached declaration by His Excellency the Governor-General refers to the compulsory acquisition of three plots of land at Zabbar.

Since this land is permanently required by the Government, it is proposed to acquire it by absolute purchase.

The above plots of land are required by the Government for the purpose of road widening; they are therefore required for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136).

From the report by the Land Engineer it transpires that the total freehold value of the above plots of land amounts to £225.18s. 0d.

Honourable Ministers are invited to recommend.

DECLARATION BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL

I hereby declare that the undermentioned land is required by the competent authority for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136) and that the acquisition thereof is to be by absolute purchase.

Description of the land

The following land at Zabbar:-

1. A plot of land of the area of 3.93 square canes, bounded on the North by Bajjada Street, on the East by a public lane, and on the South partly by property of Mr Joseph Busuttil and partly by property of Mr Carmel Magro; it is the property of the heirs of the late George Mifsud.

2. A plot of land of the area of 7.09 square canes, bounded on the North by property of the heirs of the late George Mifsud, on the East by property of Mr Carmel Magro, and on the South by the remaining portion of the land of which such plot forms part; it is the property of the heirs of the late George Mifsud as regards the directus dominium, and of Mr Joseph Busuttil as regard the utile dominium.

3. A plot of land of the area of 7.64 square canes, bounded on the North by property of the heirs of the late George Mifsud, on the East by a private lane, on the West by property of Mr Joseph Busuttil, and on the South by the remaining portion of the land of which such plot forms part; it is the property of the heirs of the late George Mifsud as regards the directus dominium, and of Mr Carmel Magro as regards the utile dominium.

The abovementioned land is shown on a plan marked L.D.101/69, which may be seen on demand at the Land Office, 29, South Street, Valletta.
