Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Cap. 136)

The attached Declaration by His Excellency the Governor-General refers to the release of two plots of land at Attard.

The two plots of land in question, together with another plot, had been declared to be required for a public purpose by the competent authority by means of a Declaration signed by His Excellency the Governor-General on the 8th November, 1967, and published by Government Notice No. 756 of the 21st November, 1967.

As the said two plots of land are no longer so required, the attached Declaration is intended for their release.

DECLARATION BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL

Whereas by declaration dated 8th November, 1967, published in the Government Gazette of the 21st November, 1967 under Notice No. 756, His Excellency the Governor-General had declared amongst other items, the undermentioned land to be required by the competent authority for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 156) and whereas the undermentioned land is no longer so required, I hereby declare for all intents and purposes of law, that the undermentioned land is no longer required by the competent authority for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the aforementioned Ordinance.

Description of the land

The following land at Attard:

1. A plot of land of the area of 4 Tumoli, 2 Sieghan and 2 Kejliet, including an undivided half of a cistern, bounded on the North by property of the Archiepiscopal Curia, on the South by property of Mr. Philip Camilleri, and on the West by Government property; it is the property of Mrs. Maria Camilleri.
2. A plot of land of the area of 4 Tumoli, 3 Sieghan and 4 Kejliet, including a farm house and an undivided half of a cistern, bounded on the North by property of Mrs. Maria Camilleri, on the South by property of family De Trafford and on the West by Government property; it is the property of Mr. Philip Camilleri.
