

MEMORANDUM BY THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE
AND PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS

Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Cap. 136)

The attached Declaration by His Excellency the Governor-General refers to the compulsory acquisition of three plots of land at St. Julians.

Since this land is permanently required by the Government, it is proposed to acquire it by absolute purchase.

The above plots of land are required by the Government in connection with the construction of a foot-bridge; they are therefore required for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136).

From the report by the Land Engineer it transpires that the total freehold value of the above plots of land amounts to £787.5.0d.

Honourable Ministers are invited to recommend.

DECLARATION BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL

I hereby declare that the undermentioned land is required by the competent authority for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136) and that the acquisition thereof is to be by absolute purchase.

Description of the land

The following land at Saint Julians:-

1. A plot of land of the area of 3.8 square canes, bounded on the West by Government property, and on the East and North by the remaining portion of the land of which such plot forms part. It is the property of the Parish Church of Saint Julians.
2. A plot of land of the area of 18.25 square canes, bounded on the East by Government property, on the West by property of Mr. Gerald Charles and on the South and North by the remaining portion of the land of which such plot forms part. It is the property of Miss Teresa Zammit.
3. A plot of land of the area of 24 square canes, bounded on the East by property of Miss Teresa Zammit and on the North and South by the remaining portion of the land of which such plot forms part. It is the property of Mr. Gerald Charles.

The above mentioned land is shown on a plan marked L.D. 216/69 which may be seen on demand at the Land Office, 29, South Street, Valletta.
