

MEMORANDUM BY THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE  
AND PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS

Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Cap. 156)

The attached Declaration by His Excellency the Governor-General refers to the compulsory acquisition of three plots of land at San Gwann.

Since this land is permanently required by the Government, it is proposed to acquire it by absolute purchase.

The above plots of land are required by the Government for the purpose of the extension of the Industrial Estate; they are therefore required for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 156).

From the report by the Land Engineer it transpires that the total freehold value of the above plots of land amounts to M621. 0. 0.

Honourable Ministers are invited to recommend.

DECLARATION BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL

I hereby declare that the under-mentioned land is required by the competent authority for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136) and that the acquisition thereof is to be by absolute purchase.

Description of the land

The following land at San Gwann:-

1. A plot of land of the area of 2 sieghan and 7.61 wejliet, bounded on the north by property of Mr. Paul Apap and others, on the south-west by property of Mrs. Elena Grech and on the south-east by property of Mr. Joseph Micallef.
  2. A plot of land of the area of 3.28 wejliet, bounded on the north-west by property of Mrs. Elena Grech, on the south-east by property of Mr. Michael Demajo and on the south-west and North-East by property of Mr. Joseph Micallef.
  3. A plot of land of the area of 1 siegh and 2.34 wejliet, bounded on the North-west by property of Mr. Joseph Micallef, on the North-east and South-west by property of Michael Demajo and on the South-east by Saint Julians Road.
