Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Cap. 136)

L-Arkiwi: Nazzjonali ta' Malta

The attached Declaration by His Excellency the Governor-General refers to the release of four premises and a shop at Zurrieq.

The said premises and shop had been declared to be required for a public purpose by the competent authority by means of a Declaration dated the 20th August, 1969, published in the Government Gazette on the 2nd September, 1969, and of another Declaration dated the 22nd July, 1970, published in the Government Gazette on the 31st July, 1970.

As the said premises and shop are no longer so required by the competent authority, the attached Declaration is intended for their release.

Honourable Ministers are invited to recommend.

DECLARATION BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL

Whereas by declaration dated 20th August, 1969, published in the Government Gazette of the 2nd September, 1969 under Notice No. 710 and by declaration dated 22nd July, 1970 published in the Government Gazette of the 31st July, 1970, under Notice No. 584. His Excellency the Governor-General had declared the undermentioned land to be required by the competent authority for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136) and whereas the undermentioned land is no longer so required, I hereby declare for all intents and purposes of law, that the undermentioned land is no longer required by the competent authority for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the aforementioned Ordinance.

Description of the land

The following land at Zurrieg:-

1. Premises No. 7, Saint Nicholas Street, corner with No. 65, Queen Street.
2. Shop No. 8, Saint Nicholas Street.
3. Premises No. 66, Queen Street.
4. Premises No. 67, Queen Street.
5. Premises No. 68, Queen Street.

The abovementioned land is shown on a plan marked L.D. 125/68, which may be seen on demand at the Land Office, 29, South Street, Valletta.
