# ORDINANCE No. III of 1928.

An Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Malta in the exercise of the powers conferred upon him by His Majesty's Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Malta bearing date the 11th April 1921 constituting the office of Governor and Commander in Chief of Malta.

To regulate the issue and management of Passports in Malta.

Enacted by the Governor of Malta in the following manner:

1. Any person who being in possession of a passport which has been issued to him by a competent authority or not transfers such passport to any other person or it is used by any other person shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years.

2. Any person who makes use of a stamp or mark on a passport issued to any other person shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years.

3. Any person who fraudulently or unlawfully obtains a passport shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years.

4. Any person who knowingly issues a passport to any other person shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years.

5. Any person who is required to do so by the Police Officer shall produce his passport to the Police Officer or to the Police Officer's representative for inspection and if he fails to do so he shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years.

6. If any person loses a passport he shall within seven days report the loss thereof to the Police Officer or to the Stationary Master and if he fails to do so he shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years.

7. Any person who fails to comply with any Regulation made by the Governor under article 8 of this Ordinance shall be liable to the punishments laid down for contraventions.

8. The Governor may from time to time make Regulations respecting the form and issue of passports and respecting the issue of passports to persons residing in or leaving Malta.

9. If expression of opinion is required in this Ordinance shall mean any decision of the Police Officer as to whether a person is or is not a British Subject or a person entitled to a passport.

10. On the 1st day of January 1929 the Ordinance No. XII of 1928 shall be repealed.

11. This Ordinance shall be called the Passport Ordinance 1928.

12. This Ordinance shall come into operation on the 1st day of January 1929.
