9. Travellers who intend to visit the Russian Empire the Turkish Dominions the Kingdom of Roumania Persia and then return to either the Russian Empire or the Turkish Dominions must not leave the United Kingdom without having their Passports issued by the British Consulate at the place of departure. 10. Although travellers are now permitted to enter most foreign countries without Passports British subjects travelling abroad are recommended to furnish themselves with them for even in those countries where they are no longer obligatory, they are found to be useful as affording a ready means of identification in case of need. British subjects intending to visit in Germany or in Switzerland are required to provide themselves with Passports.

- (c) In the case of a MARRIED WOMAN OR WIDOW the particulars of birth required are those of her HUSBAND OR late HUSBAND—not of the applicant herself
- (d) State whether a British born Subject or a naturalized British Subject. In the case of a NATURALIZED BRITISH SUBJECT, PARTICULARS OF BIRTH ARE NOT REQUIRED (see Rule 6 at back)
- (e) State whether proceeding, and Names of persons by whom accompanied (unless they hold separate passports), e.g., accompanied by my wife A. and children B. and C., with their Father, D. E. and a Governess, F. G., and Maid Servant, H. I. (if British subjects)
The Christian Names and Surname of each person must be given in full
In the case of persons proceeding to Russia, the ages of children should be stated, and the religion of the applicant will be mentioned in the passport on production of a Baptismal Certificate or other satisfactory evidence
- (f) Signature
(Where the applicant is unable to write a mark should be made by him or her in the presence of the person verifying the Declaration)

- (g) Name and Qualification of person verifying the Declaration, (see Rule 4 at back) viz —
Major Magistrate Justice of the Peace Minister of Religion Barrister at Law, Plavon, Sergeant, Solicitor, or Notary (as the case may be), giving professional or business address
Recommendations from *Banking Firms* should bear the printed stamp of the Bank
