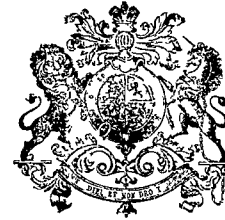

 (f) Where the applicant is unable to write, a mark should be made by him or her in the presence of the person verifying the Declaration.
 (g) Name and Qualification of person verifying the Declaration, viz —
Resident British Merchant Banker, Minister of Religion, Physician, Surgeon, Barrister, or Solicitor (as the case may be), giving
 professional or business address
 Recommendations from Banking Firms should bear the printed stamp of the Bank.
