- (a) Insert name of Place and Date
- (b) Christian Names and Surname of the applicant in full, and present address
- (c) In the case of a MARRIED WOMAN or WIDOW, the particulars of birth required are those of her HUSBAND—not of the applicant herself
- (d) State whether a British born Subject or a naturalized British Subject. IN THE CASE OF A NATURALIZED BRITISH SUBJECT, PARTICULARS OF BIRTH NEED NOT BE GIVEN
- (e) State with other proceeding names of persons by whom accompanied (unless they hold separate passports) e.g., accompanied by his wife A and children B and C with their Tutor D E, and a Governess F G and Maid Servant, H K and Man Servant L M (all British Subjects)
- (f) The Christian Name and Surname of each person must be given in full
- (g) In the case of persons proceeding to RUSSIA, the ages of children should be stated and the religion of the applicant will be mentioned in the passport on production of a Baptismal Certificate or other satisfactory evidence
- (h) Where the applicant is unable to write a mark should be made by him in the presence of the person verifying the Declaration
- (i) Name and Qualification of person verifying the Declaration, viz Resident British Merchant, Banker, Minister of Religion, Physician, Surgeon, Barrister, or Solicitor (in the case may be), giving address
- (j) Recommendations from Banking Firms should bear the printed stamp of the Bank
