- (d) State whether a British born Subject or a naturalized British Subject IN THE CASE OF A NATURALIZED BRITISH SUBJECT, PARTICULARS OF BIRTH MUST BE GIVEN
- (e) State whether proceeding and Names of persons by whom accompanied (unless they hold separate passports), e.g., accompanied by his wife A and children B and C with their Tutor, D E, and a Governess, F G and Maid Servant H K and Man Servant I J (all British Subjects)
- The Christian Name and Surname of each person must be given in full
- In the case of persons proceeding to Russia the ages of children should be stated and the religion of the applicant will be mentioned in the passport in production of a Russian Certificate or other satisfactory evidence
- (f) Where the applicant is unable to write a mark should be made by him or her in the presence of the person verifying the Declaration
- (g) Name and Qualification of person verifying the Declaration viz—
 Resident British Merchant Banker, Minister of Religion, Physician, Surgeon, Barrister or Solicitor (in the case may be) giving professional or business address.
 Recommendations from Bankers, Lawyers should bear the printed stamp of the Bank.
