

## PASSPORT REGULATIONS.

1. APPLICATIONS for Passports must be made in the form printed on the back of these Regulations, and presented personally at the Passports Office.

2. The charge for a Passport is 5/-. Passports are issued at the Passports Office, ON THE DAY FOLLOWING THAT ON WHICH THE APPLICATION FOR THE PASSPORT HAS BEEN RECEIVED, except on Sundays and Public Holidays, when the Passports Office is closed. POSTAGE STAMPS WILL NOT BE RECEIVED IN PAYMENT.

3. Passports are granted—

- (1.) To natural-born British subjects ;
- (2.) To the wives and widows of such persons ; and
- (3.) To persons naturalized in the United Kingdom, in the British Colonies or in India.

A married woman is deemed to be a subject of the State of which her husband is for the time being a subject.

4. Passports are granted—

- (1.) In the case of natural-born British subjects, upon the production of a Declaration by the applicant in the form printed on the back of these Regulations, verified by a Declaration made by a *Magistrate, Banker, Minister of Religion, Physician, Surgeon, Advocate, Legal Procurator, or Notary Public*, resident in these Islands. The applicant's Certificate of Birth and other evidence may also be required.
- (2.) In the case of children under the age of 16 years requiring a separate Passport, upon production of a Declaration made by the child's parent or guardian, in a Form (B), to be obtained upon application to the Passports Office.

5. If the applicant for a Passport be a Naturalized British subject, the Certificate of Naturalization must be produced with the Declaration.

Naturalized British subjects will be described as such in their Passports, which will be issued subject to the necessary qualifications.

6. Passports are not available beyond two years from the date of issue. They may be renewed for four further periods of two years each, after which fresh Passports must be obtained. The fee for each renewal is 2s.

7. A Passport cannot be issued on behalf of a person already abroad ; such person should apply for one to the nearest British Mission or Consulate. Passports must not be sent out of these Islands by post.

## GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

[No. 256.]

It is hereby notified that applications for Passports will not be accepted in future unless the application form be countersigned by the Police Divisional Inspector of the district in which the applicant resides.

This regulation does not, however, exempt applicants for passports from the obligation of having their declaration verified by any of the persons mentioned in paragraph 4 of the Passports Regulations printed on the application form.

(b) Christian Names and Surname of the applicant in full and present address.

(c) In the case of a MARRIED WOMAN OR WIDOW, the particulars of birth required are those of her HUSBAND OR LATE HUSBAND—not of the applicant herself.

(d) State whether a British-born Subject or a naturalized British Subject.

(e) Wife and children should only be included if they do not possess separate passports. Strike out the sentence in other cases.  
Persons travelling in Asia must state the routes to be followed.

(f) The words in brackets to be struck out and initialled in cases where the applicant has no previous passport in his possession.

(g) Signature.

The whole of the declaration and marginal particulars should be in the applicant's own handwriting.

(h) Name and Qualification of person verifying the Declaration (see Rule 4 at back), viz:—  
Magistrate, Banker, Minister of Religion, Physician, Surgeon, Advocate, Legal Procurator or Notary Public, giving professional or business address.

# PASSPORT REGULATIONS.

1. Applications for Passports must be made in the authorized form and presented personally at the Lieutenant-Governor's Office.

2. The charge for a Passport is 5/- Passports are issued at the Lieutenant-Governor's Office, on the day following that on which the application for the Passport has been received, except on Sundays and Public Holidays, when the Passport Office is closed. POSTAGE STAMPS WILL NOT BE RECEIVED IN PAYMENT.

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A married woman is deemed to be a subject of the State of which her husband is for the time being a subject.

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- (2) In the case of children, under the age of 16 years, requiring a separate Passport upon production of a Declaration made by the child's parent or guardian, in a Form (B), to be obtained upon application to the Lieutenant-Governor's Office.

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7. A Passport cannot be issued on behalf of a person already abroad; such person should apply for one to the nearest British Mission or Consulate. Passports must not be sent out of these Islands by post.
