OPM. 504/65. Landing of an aircraft from Prague at
Luga airfield.

(Mr. E. Cuschieri, Administrative Secretary, Prof. J. Aemona, Crown Advocate-General, Mr. P. Dejeu, Commissioner of Police, and Mr. L. Hicks, Director of Civil Aviation, were in attendance).

The Cabinet was informed that the aircraft which landed at Luga airfield on the 4th February, 1965, with a load of munitions was found to be carrying markings which were not according to the certificate of registration.

On landing the spokesman of the crew stated that the aircraft was

was registered in Ghana, but the authorities in Accra denied this statement by cable on the 8th February, 1965.

It was decided that -
 The Crown Advocate-General should institute all necessary legal proceedings against the Captain of the aircraft. Meanwhile, the Director of Civil Aviation was to ask the authorities in Ghana to confirm in writing that the aircraft in question, bearing markings 9 G-28, was not in fact on the Ghana registers on the date of its landing in Malta, viz: 4th February, 1965.
