Publication of the Revised Electoral Register
(Memo. No. 571).

It was brought to the knowledge of Ministers that the recent election had made it difficult for the Chief Electoral Commissioner to be able to publish the April 1966 edition of the revised electoral register as required by law. It was therefore agreed that the necessary legislative step, as per draft Bill annexed to Memorandum No. 571, be taken to dispense the Chief Electoral Commissioner from that obligation.

UNESCO Convention concerning the Exchange of Official Publications and Government Documents (Memo. No. 559).

Hon. Ministers confirmed the accession of Malta to the UNESCO Convention concerning the Exchange of Official Publications and Government Documents between States, adopted by the General Council in 1958, and agreed that Malta should accede to the second UNESCO Convention concerning the International Exchange of Publications.

Hon. Ministers agreed to the non-ratification of the amendment to Article 7 of the Constitution of the World Health Organisation.
