Cabinet meeting held at the Auberge d'Angon, Valletta, on Tuesday, 5th December, 1964, at 11 am.

OPM. 903/64. Construction of a Restaurants and Club House
at Ramona Road, Sliema (Memo. No. 805)

Reference was made to
the decision taken in Cabinet on the 30th
November, 1964, on the above subject (Sitting
No. 108/64). The Cabinet approved also
the construction of small jetties provided
that they would be ^{arranged} ~~fully accessible~~ to

be public property and accessible to the public at all times.

Developments Corporation.

It was confirmed that the Hon. Mr. Justice T. Jander was unable to accept the Chairmanship of the Malta Development Corporation. The Cabinet agreed that the Hon. Prime Minister should sound Sir Sadler Foster about the post.

Retirements before the age limit.

Mention was made of those public officers who were leaving the service ostensibly for health reasons and who were immediately afterwards accepting posts in business and other private sector. It was agreed that this matter be gone into and reported upon to Cabinet by the Hon. Minister of Justice, Parliamentary Affairs, the Hon. Minister of Health and the Hon. Minister of Education, Culture & Leisure.

OPM. 976/66.

Claim by the Sgo Bus Owners for an increase in bus fares.

Reference was made to the decision taken in Cabinet on the 20th October, 1967, on the above subjects, and to the remarks of the Commissioner of Police (Ref 34 in file) on certain misunderstandings.
