Employment at the Malta College of Arts, Science and Technology of Mr. Sydney Wallace Scutt (Memo. No. 1025)

The Cabinet considered Memorandum No. 1025 concerning the decision taken in Cabinet on the 26th March, 1968 (Sitting No. 24/68) on the above subject. The matter was raised again as it was felt by the Hon. Minister of Education, Culture & Leisure that the implementation of the Cabinet's decision would mean that fifty-five students in three different courses in Electrical Engineering would be missing Mr. Scutt's lectures two months before their examinations. It was therefore considered imperative for the College authorities to employ Mr. Scutt who was a very well-qualified Electrical Engineer with considerable experience both in the industrial field and in lecturing work.

Under the circumstances the Cabinet was prepared to reconsider its earlier decision and treat this matter as a special case. Ministers therefore approved the employment at the Malta College of Arts, Science and Technology of Mr. Sydney Wallace Scutt until the end of the current session only provided that Mr. Scutt paid the full rate of the Malta Income Tax on his earnings.
