Amana in accordance with the terms mentioned in the last paragraph of the memorandum, and also on condition that (i) the existing gate on the foreshore be removed to render the whole foreshore freely accessible to the public, and (ii) a free access to the public be provided from the higher to the lower level of the ground by means of steps, as shown on the plan.
