

Memorandum no. 20/67.

Cabinet Meeting held at the Auberge d'Aragon, Valletta, on Tuesday, 15th July, 1967, at 11 a.m.

Present: The Hon. Prime Minister
The Hon. Minister of Public Building & Works.
The Hon. Minister of Justice and Parliamentary Affairs.
The Hon. Minister of Trade, Industry and Agriculture.
The Hon. Minister of Education, Culture and Tourism.
The Hon. Minister of Labour, Employment and Welfare.

Absent: The Hon. Minister of Finance, Customs and Ports, who was indisposed.
The Hon. Minister of Health, who was away from the Islands on official business.

OPM. 991/66.

Several Authority of the Cabinet to the Hon. Minister of Trade, Industry and Agriculture and to Hon. Ministers of Education, Culture and Tourism.

Ministers referred to their decision taken in Cabinet on the 10th October, 1962, and confirmed on the 1st June, 1966, concerning the delegation made by

the Cabinet in favour of the then Minister of Industrial Development and Tourism in respect of industrial and hotel projects.

As stated by the Crown Advocate General, since the enactment of the Malta Development Corporation Act, 1964, the delegation of the Cabinet was now needed only for the purpose of the advice tendered to H.E. the Governor General in respect of Exemption Orders. Ministers therefore agreed that the delegation referred to in para. 1 above be withdrawn and that the Hon. Minister of Trade, Industry and Agriculture be now given the general authority of the Cabinet to advise His Excellency on Exemption Orders relating to industrial projects except hotel projects, and that the Hon. Minister of Education, Culture and Tourism be given the authority of the Cabinet to advise His Excellency on Exemption Orders relating to hotel projects.

OPM. 488/69. Fees for services rendered in connection with the bus fare survey (Joint Study Group).

Ministers agreed to the payment of an appropriate fee to those outsiders nominated by the General Transport Union and appointed by the Government to serve as members of the Joint Study Group.

OPM. 30/66 Section 117 of the Code of the Police Laws (Laws No. 1266) (The Crown Advocate General was in attendance).

Ministers considered Memorandum No. 1266 and agreed that ~~that~~ ^{act} ad hoc legislation should be prepared which would distinguish, and provide for, different types of activities on the basis as to whether such activities caused nuisance, injury or danger to neighbours.

CPM. 385/69. Legislation regarding the safe operation of aircraft used for the public transport of passengers (Memo. No. 1304).
(The Amen Advocate General was in attendance)

Ministers considered Memorandum No. 1304 and, after hearing the advice of the Amen Advocate General, agreed that

a) The Civil Aviation (Air Operators Certificates) Act, 1969, be printed and brought before the House of Representatives, and

b) The Air Operators' Certificates Regulations, 1969, be made as soon as the above Act was enacted.
