OPN. 702/64. Appointment of Mr. Victor F. Dormanin as
Commissioner of Oaths.

Ministers agreed that
H.E. the Governor General be advised to appoint
Mr. Victor F. Dormanin, serving in the High
Commission for Malta in London, as Commissioner
for Oaths under the provisions of section 2(2)

of the Commissioners for Oaths Ordinance (Chapter 230) and to sign the relative Warrant.

Erection of a Migrants Memorial Club in St. Ursula Street, Valletta (near the Upper Barracks).

Ministers had before them a letter-minute from the Minister of Justice and Parliamentary Affairs (Ref 17 in file) and a letter from Mr. Philip Calleja (Ref 18 in file) concerning the use of the site at St. Ursula Street, near the Upper Barracks, Valletta. It was agreed that the Maltese Migrants' Commission be asked to submit plans of their proposed Migrants' Memorial Building.

Lack of Skilled Personnel in the Building Industry (Memo. No. 1400)

(The Crown Advocate General and the Director of Public Works were in attendance)

Ministers considered Memorandum No. 1400. The Crown Advocate General was asked to express his views on the proposals at another meeting of the Cabinet when the matter was to be considered further.

Establishment in Malta of a Convalescent Centre for Scandinavian patients (Memo. No. 1390)

Ministers considered Memorandum No. 1390. They were favourably disposed to the proposals of the Swedish

Medical authorities for the establishment by them in Malta of a convalescent centre for Scandinavian patients. They could not agree, however, to the choice of Bighi Hospital before they had the views of the Commissioner of Land as Chairman of the Standing Committee set up to select sites for hotel development on the possible eventual grant of Bighi for the construction of a hotel or for some other tourist project.
