

MEMORANDUM BY THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE

Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136)

Attached Declaration by His Excellency the Governor refers to an acquisition by absolute purchase parts of four tenements at St Paul's Street, Luqa. This is required in connection with road widening.

The acquisition is for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136).

It emerges from valuation report of the Land Engineer that compensation for acquisition by outright purchase of the property in question as freehold would amount to £1,150. 0s. Od.

The demolition and reinstatement expenses of facades to be incurred by Government for re-alignment are not included in this estimate.

Hon. Ministers are invited to recommend.

DECLARATION BY THE GOVERNOR

I hereby declare that the undermentioned land is required by the competent authority for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136) and that the acquisition thereof is to be by absolute purchase.

Description of the Land

The following land at Luqa:-

1. Part of premises No. 16, St Paul Street, consisting of an entrance hall, an adjoining room and part of the stairwell at ground floor level having an area of 367 square feet, and of the part of the said premises overlying the property above described; it is the property of Mr Anthony Scerri and others.

2. Part of premises No. 17A, St Paul Street, consisting of part of the front room at ground floor level having an area of 233 square feet; it is the property of Mr Spiro Ellul and others.

3. Part of premises No. 18, St Paul Street, consisting of part of a room at ground floor level, having an area of 135 square feet, of the part of the said premises overlying the property above described and of the part of the same premises overlying that part of premises No. 17A, St Paul Street, described in paragraph 2 above; it is the property of Mr Spiro Ellul and others.

4. Part of premises No. 19, St Paul Street, consisting of two rooms at ground floor level having an area of 230 square feet, and of the part of the said premises overlying the property above described; it is the property of the Misses Rosaria and Carmela De Leonardi.

The above mentioned land is shown on plan marked L.D. 24/64 which may be seen on demand at the Land Office, 29, South Street, Valletta.
